Over 70 people from Vermont, New York and New Hampshire attended the annual Vermont Educational Opportunity Programs' conference, held at Vermont Technical College on October 11. Keynote Speaker Fernando Cardenas, COE Coordinator for Alumni Affairs, provided a wonderful springboard for the day by sharing his compelling personal story and describing a range of engaging and attainable alumni initiatives. Ramon Gonzalez gave the NEOA update on upcoming professional development opportunities and the early planning for the 2018 NEOA Conference, which will be in Vermont. Educational aides for Senator Leahy and Senator Sanders were also present and supportive of TRIO as always.

Ten workshops covered a range of topics from the new First Generation/Working Class Initiative to UB Grant Writing to Self-Authored Advising. Our basket raffle raised \$600 for this year's VEOP scholarships and 12 people contributed to Fair Share. It was a great day!

MEOA held its 32nd annual conference on October 13, 2016. Over 100 MEOA professionals attended the conference, which had the theme of Civic Engagement for Social Change. Charles Desmond, Ed. D. - Senior Fellow, New England Board of Higher Education was the

plenary speaker. His heartfelt topic was why the MEOA community must continue to fight. The workshops included such topics as Guidelines for Success: Helping English Language Learners Develop Writing and Apply to College, Management and Supervision: No one told you it would be easy, Redesigned SAT Suite of Assessments, and Trauma: Impacts on biological, psychological, and social functioning and understanding how to provide or refer support. Two of the five MEOA scholarship recipients were on hand for the luncheon to personally offer their thanks of support to the MEOA community.

New England Student Leadership Conference September 23-25, 2016



The New England Student Leadership Conference is an event sponsored by the Lyndon State College and SUNY Plattsburgh Upward Bound Programs. Over 60 Upward Bound, Talent Search and Gear-Up students and staff from throughout New England and Northern New York are provided opportunities to develop, refine, and implement their leadership skills. Some of the activities provided are the Eclipse Challenge, a firsthand look at how the United States budget is produced; workshops on the roles and responsibilities of good leaders; action plan development workshops that help students learn how to address real issues; and, team building activities on a ropes course. The Leadership Conference is held at the Hulbert Outdoor Center, located on the banks of Lake Morey (Fairlee, Vermont).

Green Mountain/Adirondacks Scholars Bowl



The Green Mountain/Adirondacks Scholars Bowl is an annual event co-sponsored by all the Upward Bound Programs in Vermont and Northern New York.
